Minutes of General Meeting October 22, 2016

Isaac Henning led us all in the flag salute. A moment of silence, led by Dale Fye, for Gene Brady and Don Fifer. Dale noted that we have five founding members of the club present at this meeting, Dan Nicholas, Mike Moyer, Curt Warner, and John and Cindy Neitzel. The minutes from April meeting were read and approved. The board meeting minutes from today were read and approved. April reported that the treasury is doing quite well. Even with our standard deductions for the newsletters, facility rentals and show expenses, we have a net profit of almost \$1700 this year (last year we only had \$788). Our expenses included a purchase of a porta-potty, swap/show ads and newsletter expenses. We have over \$6500 in the bank in addition to our CDs. A side note: Darrell Durbin refused to take any pay for his auctioneer duties but was satisfied with just a meal after the auction. OLD BUSINESS Show Report: Nick Huff asked if we couldn't find more food vendors. The feed-back from the public also mentioned this. The show attendees also said this was a great show and that they are happy that it's only getting bigger and better. Tammy Spadoni and Cindy Neitzel will continue to spearhead a plant sale at the show. They are looking for donations of plants, pots, and starts/seedlings. Frank Stricklin has pots that he will drop off at the show grounds and also has some at his house if anyone wants to pick them up. Members are asking about club tshirts and hats. It's a great idea but someone has to take the lead and design a good logo for they club. One suggestion was to just have the words AFE&TA and Branch 245. Another idea is to list sponsors on the back. The sponsors being business or private people who would help pay for the t-shirts and have their name on them as advertising. Frank Stricklin said that he has a computer program that will format the design but only if someone gives him a logo or design. Dan Nicholas will talk to Phil Wahl about our old patch. We then discussed the kid's Passport Program during the show. This is an event for just the kids. They are given a list of displays, or "passport stations", to find on the showgrounds. They are expected to ask the exhibitor questions about the display and then get their "passport" initialed or stamped. When their passport is completed they return it to the "passport office" and their passport is then entered into a raffle. This year

there were two bicycles given away. No participant went home without a prize of some sort. The kids loved this activity as did the exhibitors. Many of the kids asked detailed questions and were honestly curious about our old engines, grinders, oilers, etc. The plan is to operate a passport program again next year. So, be thinking about a display that the kids could learn from.

Dale has purchased two American sawmills. He will be working on them this spring to hopefully get them running for the show. They are both cant mills. Dale will be using a flat belt and a tractor to run them. If anyone is interested in helping Dale set up the mills let him know. A shed needs to be built to protect them as well as a fence/guard rail around them to protect the public from injury. NEW BUSINESS April reported that we, the club, now has a coffee hour every 2nd and 4th Wednesday of the month at 9am starting this November. It is held at the Sister's Restaurant in downtown Shelton on the corner of 1st and Railroad. Feel free to join in and talk shop with other like-minded club members. We were told that not only do they have good coffee, they have a good breakfast menu. December 3rd is the club's Holiday Party at the Shelton PUD building. That evening at 5pm the Shelton Christmas Parade will be happening. You will need to park your truck and trailer downtown and unload your tractor and put any lights on it down there. Frank Stricklin may bring his people mover if anyone wants to ride. Please contact Frank for details. Next year's swap meet will be April 29th, the last weekend in April like it always has been. Do we want to do a second swap meet in October? Many of the vendors from the April swap have shown an interest for one in the fall as well as new vendors who would like to participate. There was talk of adding a gas-up to the fall because this would bring in more participants. We voted and approved to have a fall gas-up/swap meet on the third Saturday of October, which will be the 21st next year. Ken Christensen brought his big Fitch tractor to our show this year. Pictures of the tractor ended up on the internet and was seen by the Antique Power Magazine staff. Now, they want to come out to Aberdeen and take more pictures for their magazine. We are searching for volunteers to head on down to Ken's place with their elbow grease to thoroughly clean this tractor. There's a lot there that needs cleaning. Please give Dale

or Ken a call if you'd like to help. We need to decide on a feature tractor or engine for next year's show. We will use this for advertising, buttons and maybe even tshirts and hats. We asked the 5 founding members attending the meeting to try to come up with something for us. We should vote on this at the next meeting. Dan Nicholas had an invitation from Phil Wahl inviting the club to participate in the King Country Fair in Enumclaw next year, The participation has been falling in recent years and they would like to see more tractors and engines participate. The invitation actually came from the Rainier Tractor Club. There is a concrete show area and room to dry camp with your camper next to your exhibit. There are hookups available, for a fee, in the general camping area. The only downside is your tractor and/or exhibit must be set up on Wednesday and you can't remove it until the next Monday. The dates are the weekend after our show, July 12-16th. The fair itself is July 13-15th. We asked Dan to check to see if the engine displays would have to be static displays. Please let Dan know if you're at all interested. There is interest in the group to purchase a big event tent similar to the one we borrowed this year from John Puliz. Several members have seen them selling on auction sites in the area for not a lot of money. It's also possible we may be able to build one. Frank Stricklin will do some research. We agreed we need to have removable sides. April noted that she's always getting inquiries from the swap meet vendors about covered

vending spots. This tent could be used for that and then during the show as a gathering place, like this year. We will discuss this further as the show and swap gets closer. Cindy Neitzel invited us all to attend both the EDGE&TA NW Regional Show in Twin Falls Idaho in June (16-17) and the Pendleton Oregon 12th Annual Heritage Station Museum, Old Iron Show which is also in June on the 2nd and 3rd. And last but not least by any means.....nomination of officers. Last year we decided to extend all officers for one year during the transition to EDGE&TA. The year is up so all offices are open for nominations. The following nominations will be voted on at the January 7 2017 meeting. If anyone would like to add their name to the nominees, please call Dale Fye. We need to rotate people through the offices and not have the same people feeling obligated to hold an office over and over. Fresh ideas are always welcome. President Dale Fye ?? Minutes of Board Meeting October 22, 2016

April presented the budget report. She will explain it in detail at the general meeting. Bottom line is - we made money this year, double what we made last year even though we had many more expenditures, which means we had a lot more income. The plant sale was a huge success. We made a lot of money on this venture since 99.9% of the items were donated. Tammy Spadoni and Cindy Neitzel will spearhead a plant sale for next year's show. Please provide plants, starts, pots and misc garden items to them. Our 1st annual auction was also a big success. We plan to have another auction this year. In the months to come we will investigate purchasing more porta-potties, including a handicap unit. In the long run we'd be money ahead to have our own to pump out rather then renting units for each event. Please keep your eyes and ears open for opportunities to purchase some. Someone could contact outfits in the area to see if they surplus their old units. As long as they are not damaged, just worn, we may be able to purchase a couple. The club also needs to start researching the purchase of a large event tent, with removable sides. This tent could be used during the swap meet as covered vendor space and during the show as a gathering place. The income from the covered vendor space would pay for the tent within a couple of years if not sooner. April gets many inquiries looking for indoor vendor space, and ends up turning people away because we don't have any. Any research

accomplished will be reported at the next meeting. We discussed having a fall swap meet. There seems to be a lot of interest in both the local community and the engine/tractor community. Further discussion at the general meeting. We need to start looking for more food vendors. The vendors in the local area that April has contacted in the past are reluctant to come if we can't provide them with a large attendance forecast. Maybe this year, since the show went so well, we can tell them a large enough number that they will participate. If anyone knows of a food vendor that may participate, contact them and if they are in fact interested, have them contact April. We also talked about sponsorship of the show rather than charging admission. We need to put out feelers to local businesses and see if any are interested in providing funding. If so, we can then put their business information (business card?) on our flyers and hang their banners/business information on the fence, event tent, a tractor, or a truck so we are advertising for them throughout the show. Any ideas on this are welcome. We also discussed the need to get our swap and show advertising out earlier and more visible to the community. It was suggested we put our show and swap banner on a vehicle or tractor and park it somewhere very visible in Shelton (like WalMart). It was also suggested that we distribute our flyer at the local schools with the information about the Youth Passport Program and associated raffle.
