1. EVERYONE ENTERS THROUGH THE MAIN GATES

Defining showground's roadways will be paramount in flowing traffic effectively. One way traffic flow will be crucial.

2. ENTRY ORGANIZATION FOR CAMPERS, EXHIBITORS AND VENDORS
Set a plan on the 29th to keep the JOHNS CREEK DRIVE public roadway clear
Sign everyone up as they enter to alleviate stress on the Sign up desk help

4. CAMPING

If you are camping, call APRIL TODAY (360)490-8441

DO NOT ENTER ON THE SIDE ROAD. ENTRY WILL BE THROUGH ONE OF THE MAIN GATES DEPENDING ON YOUR VEHICLE HEIGHT AND DESTINATION. You will be parked according to your wishes, judged by your attitude, how many things you bring to show and what show jobs you are willing to help with, not kidding but bribery won't be shunned.



5. SPECTATOR PARKING

No parking on Johns Creek Road entrance as in years passed. INSTALL NO PARKING SIGNS SO THEY DO NOT BLOCK THE "NEW NEIGHBOR'S" GATE OR FENCE. Parking will be allowed nose up to the fence, past the ADA parking signs unless you qualify. **CREEKSIDE PARKING** as we had at the Spring Swap Meet is available as well as **BARN YARD PARKING** that we have not ever used is ACROSS THE CREEK. Attendants needed to avoid a chaos.

6. EXIT OPTIONS

ONE WAY has suited us well in the past, some changes to traffic routes on the showgrounds may be required this year. IF spectators or exhibitors use the BARN YARD PARKING EXIT SIGNS AND FLAGGING will be needed.
