Old Business

At each meeting we call for discussion on "Old Business" and It's time we discuss and actually put our show grounds agreement down on paper. For the members who don't attend meetings or are new, here's the back story: Our club traded in nonperforming CDs and built a building on private land. The club has worked with the land owners to clean up the property and the club has been using the facility for a sweat equity exchange (no rental money changes hands). The land owners pays the taxes and insurance on the building and use the building when the club isn't using it. They land owners are continuing to make other improvements to the grounds themselves as the property is a farm and rental facility.

To date, we have been operating on a solid hand shake and it's working well. Here's how: Branch 245 has work party dates throughout the year, holds occasional meetings, host two swap meets and a show each year at the grounds. Branch 245 members have access for set up and camping the day before each swap meet, access to the facility for a week for show set up, show time and show clean up. During these club activities all camping and vendor fees are Branch 245s to keep. The club voted previously to give the show gate admissions to the land owners and to help bring more public in they have not charged an admission fee.

Prior to this arrangement Branch 245 rented halls for meetings for \$100-\$300 each and the Grays Harbor Fairgrounds where we paid \$375/day for a swap meet area and \$3000 for our show/pull area. Fiscally, this has been a good venture and the details of this will be discussed at the meeting. The club's membership dropped when we moved away from the Grays Harbor tractor show/pull but has regained to 187 rostered club members; 96 of which are EDGETA members.

New Business

Here's what will be presented: two documents. **Number One:** *a land use agreement* that states we continue as we are, allowing Branch 245 to use the grounds and make betterments or additions as mutually agreed upon.

The land use agreement will specify that if the club disbands or nullifies the land use agreement any improvements become the land owners. It will also specify that if the land owners nullify the land use agreement the club will be reimbursed for the club's cost of the building (\$11000). It is recognized that there are other improvements besides the building that have been worked on jointly. As the landowner has procured and donated much of the building materials or paid out of pocket personally for the materials for the other improvements and structures, there would be no monetary reimbursement for those additions. This land use agreement will state that the land owners shall use the building and improvements with no adversity from the club. **Number two. The Club will sign a** lease agreement for their events and continue to provide proof of insurance naming the land owners as also insured. This lease agreement will specify the exchange of sweat equity for rent with the club preparing the grounds for the club's activities.
