Minutes of Board Meeting

April 9, 2016

The new By-Laws were published.. We should vote to accept at the General Meeting. Judy Huff reported that the buttons were ordered and have already been received. They are "generic" this year but will feature a members tractor or engine beginning next year. The buttons will be used as proof of admission. Swap Meet and Show advertising was discussed. We will use as much free advertising as possible. April will put an ad in the local Shelton paper like she did last year, as we decided the cost was worth the amount of people it attracted to both the show and the swap. We will make sure it gets entered on Craigslist, too. There are radio stations in the area, like the one in Aberdeen/Hoquiam that will broadcast information on the show for free. We will again use the Farm's porta potty and order a handicap stall for both the Swap and Show. Only 2 total are needed for the Swap, but we will need several more for the Show. April and Dale have been contacted by local residents if they could bring their household items to the swap meet to sell. We decided since they will be paying for a stall to allow it and see how it goes. They will be in a separate area and will be told that no "junk" will be allowed. Dale reported that two Simplicity garden tractors and a Sears garden tractor have been donated to the club. Not sure what to do with them, so, one of our youth members asked for one and we voted to turn the best one over to him - one of the Simplicities, along with the attachments. Several discussions have been had about a new or better layout for the show. The swap meet area was somewhat out in the middle and not the best representation for the show. And maybe the tractors and engines need to be up closer to the main gate. After the meeting we will head out to the grounds and maybe agree on a different layout. April reported that there will be a Sunday afternoon consignment auction under the control of the Old Iron Event Center. The consigners, when they sign up, will be given an admission button. The dirt/rock compactor has not been available. And the rental compactor is being used by the state right now. Dale will continue trying to get a hold of the owner of the compactor used last year but we may end up having to rent one. Admission has been set at \$4 for an individual and \$10 for a family. We are looking for some local entertainment and food vendors. We will try to set up a Family Pack Show Pass to be given away by several of the local radio stations. We will talk to KAYO, KGY and KMPS and other stations. Judy said the club should have T-shirts and caps for sale at our Shows and Swaps. Minutes of General Meeting. April 9, 2016

The meeting started with a moment of silence for Olaf Skrogstad who passed away last month. Then Isaac Henning led us all in the flag salute.

Dale updated us on the health of Paul Pearman. He had a heart attack late last year and is doing much better.

The minutes from January were approved as printed in the newsletter.

The board meeting minutes from today were read and approved.

April reported that the treasury has seen much action of late and with all the dues recently paid, we have in excess of \$6000 and our CDs.

We then discussed that the club members should be on the look out for any handicap accessible porta potties for sale. It's expensive to rent one, owning one may be better as It is only \$40-\$50 to have one serviced for the weekend. We'd save money in the long run.

OLD BUSINESS

The By-Laws were revised at a meeting of the board members and then printed in the newsletter. Approved and seconded. Will now file with the Secretary of State, as required.

John Neitzel reported on the progress of prepping the showgrounds. There are lots of rocks that need to be picked and the ground needs to be smoothed and seeded. We will rent a compactor to press the remaining rocks into the ground prior to seeding. This worked well last year. It will cost \$400-500 dollars and we all decided the cost is worth it.

Tammy Spadoni has volunteered to spearhead a plant sale at the swap. She is looking for donations of plants, pots, and starts/seedlings.

Cindy Neitzel is coordinating the sign-up sheet for the show. Please sign up and then show up at the time you selected. The more people who sign up for gate duty, the less time will be required for each time period.

The Swap needs help with signs and the tent may need repairs. We will set it up later today to see what's needed.

April is in the middle of coordinating an auction. Our hope is it will not only keep the exhibitors in place through Sunday afternoon, but it will draw in both returning public from Saturday and new participants. There will be a small consignment fee and only farm related items will be accepted. Tractors, engines, household antiques, old farm tools, even antique vehicles will be the only items acceptable. No junk please. The better we do this year, the better the auction next year. Please talk to April about getting a consignment form to fill out. Not sure yet who the auctioneer will be, but there are several local individuals to choose from. And please let everyone know, there will be NO buyers premium.

NEW BUSINESS

Advertising for the Swap Meet will be the same as last year.

April announced that it is time to add John and Cindy Neitzel to our lifetime membership roster. They helped start the club and have been participating members ever since. It was a quick unanimous vote!

Please don't forget to bring a food item to each meeting. The food is then distributed to the closest food bank to the meeting location.

Three tractors have been donated to the club, two Simplicitys and a larger Sears tractor with a mower deck. Because Isaac Henning has shown such an interest in our old equipment, the club has given him one of the Simplicity tractors. We've also had an 8N and a 9N donated. Both need some minor work. Once they are finished, we will have to decide what to do with them. If they are repaired in time, we could include them in the consignment auction or we could raffle them off at a later date.

Frank Stricklin says he's interested in using his tractor in local parades. He does have a people mover that he may also use. He asked how do drivers get an OK from EDGETA. Dale will look into this for him.

The Olympic Peninsula Tractor Club has announced there will be an auction of Nelis Van der Pol's tractors after their tractor pull on Sunday the 5th of July.


